



## Civil Air Patrol – Statesboro Composite Squadron



Civil Air Patrol (CAP), the official civilian auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force, is an active part of the aviation community at

Statesboro–Bulloch County Airport. CAP is a nonprofit organization that supports aviation, emergency services, and youth leadership development through hands-on, mission-oriented training.

Operating from the airport, CAP members train in flight operations, aviation safety, radio communications, and emergency response, and regularly support search and rescue and disaster relief missions in coordination with local, state, and federal agencies. Our presence at the airport allows members to gain real-world exposure to general aviation environments, airport operations, and flight-line safety.

CAP's Cadet Program introduces youth ages 12–18 to aviation through classroom instruction, simulator training, and orientation flights flown by FAA-certified volunteer pilots. Cadets learn how airports function, how aircraft operate, and what it takes to become a safe and responsible pilot. For cadets pursuing aviation careers, CAP provides mentoring, structured flight experiences, and access to flight scholarships that can assist with earning a Private Pilot License (PPL).

The Statesboro Composite Squadron welcomes both cadets and adult volunteers—pilots and non-pilots—who are interested in aviation, public service, and supporting the local airport community.
